

Using the Club Laptop and Projector in 'screen extended mode'



Open Irfanview by clicking the icon on the laptops task bar:



This opens the Irfanview "Main Program Window"; if necessary, move the window, to the "Projector Screen", (as in the screen shot below), by left mouse click, hold and drag the window across, but leave the Irfanview 'Thumbnails Window' on the laptop screen.

(Conversely, if both windows are open on the projector screen, then drag over the Irfanview 'Thumbnails Window' from the projector screen to the laptop screen).





Dragging the screen across to the "projector":

Active screen:

When you have two screens, the system remembers which window you were using last and that remains the **active window** until you change it.

It may be necessary to occasionally left mouse click the top of the 'projector' window to make it 'active'.

Reviewing the two screens below, note that the left screen text at the top, (File Edit etc.) is **black**, (active), whereas the right hand screen text is **grey**, (not active).



Opening Files, Photos:

Ensure the Irfanview window on the Projector screen is the active window by left mouse clicking in the top margin.


Do **not** use “File>Open”, **instead**, Press “**T**” to open the “**Irfanview Thumbnails**” Window, (which should open on the laptop screen, otherwise drag it over.

Using the “Irfanview Thumbnails” Window, open the location of the photos, e.g. C:/.....”folder_Name”:


In the following example directory I have used, C:\Users\Horley\Pictures\:

(Where I have copied members memory sticks on to the hard disk drive in a new folder: “01 HPC 5 x 15 (2017)”).

Inside the first folder, “HPC 1 VB>Carcassone2016_Copy”, if you, double left mouse click, the first photo, (“(1001).jpg” in this example), it will open in the Irfanview Window:



Once clicked, Irfanview opens the photo in the ‘Main Program Window’, now located on the projector screen:




If the “Enter” key is pressed this toggles maximising/minimising the display:



Use the right arrow key, to move through the folder of photos, (the left arrow key will move backwards).

When you reach the last photo in the folder a dialogue box appears:




Carefully press the escape, “Esc” key, or left mouse click the “Cancel” button, shown above, to clear the “Browse Subfolders” dialogue box.

On the laptop the “Irfanview Thumbnails” window should still be showing.

Locate the **next folder** to show on the projector and double left mouse click, the **first** photo, as previously.

Again, using the right arrow key to move through the folder of photos until a dialogue box appears,et seq.



This procedure works reasonably smoothly, but needs practise. Be careful about clicking the mouse accidentally or using the mouse wheel, both will advance the photos.

Notes:

Using the Esc key once will minimise Irfanview.

Using the Esc key twice will close Irfanview.
